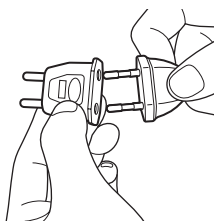

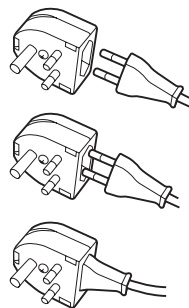

Notice for customers in South Africa

The Euro/South Africa converter plug should be fitted as follows.

- 1 Insert the power supply or CEE7 plug in to the converter plug.
- 2 Use an appropriate screwdriver to attach the screw tightly without damaging the screw head.
- 3 TEST: Grip the converter plug, and pull the VDE cord set/transformer to ensure it is fully secure, if not then increase the torque setting and further tighten.
Re-test.



The converter plug is now ready for use.

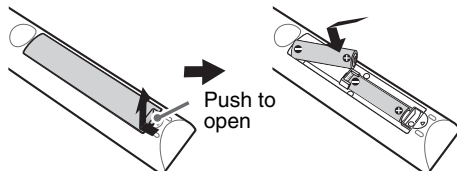

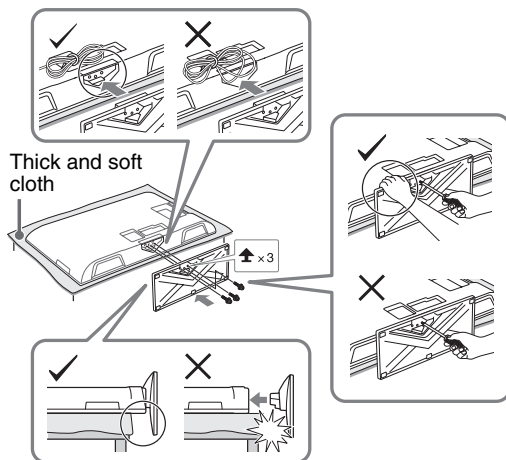

1: Attaching the stand

- Refer to the supplied stand leaflet for proper attachment for some TV models.
- For best picture quality, do not expose the screen to direct illumination or sunlight.
- Place the TV with its screen facing down on a level and stable surface covered with a thick and soft cloth.
- Hold the Table-Top Stand with one hand to avoid it dropping when attaching.



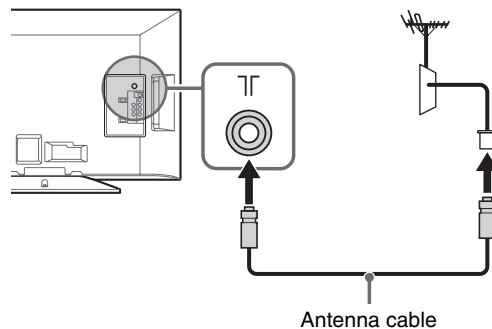
* Be careful not to hit the Table-Top Stand against the edge of the surface when attaching it.

- If using an electric screwdriver, set the tightening torque at approximately 1.5 N·m (15 kgf·cm).
- Ensure the AC power cord is away from screw holes during stand installation to avoid damage to the AC power cord.

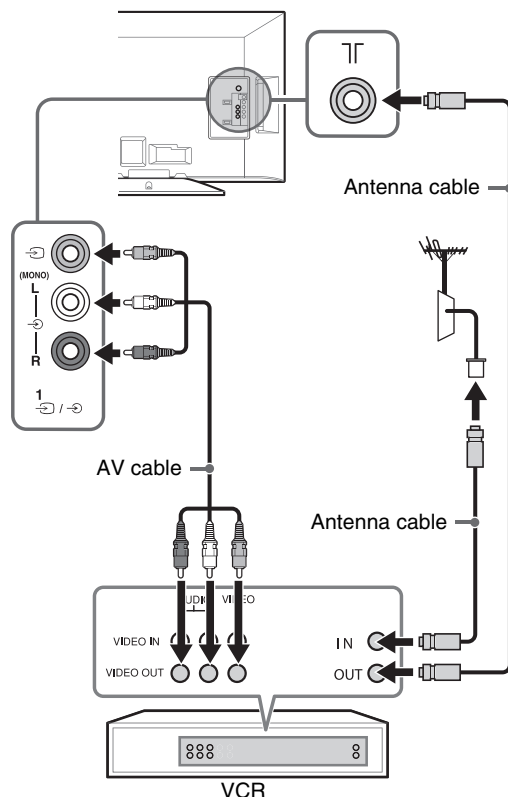

Connecting an antenna/cable

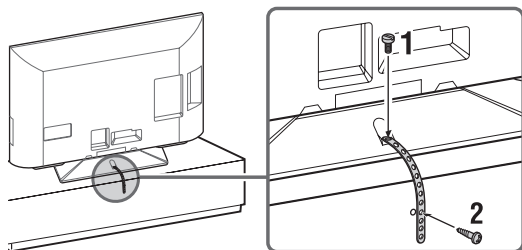


Connecting an antenna/cable and VCR



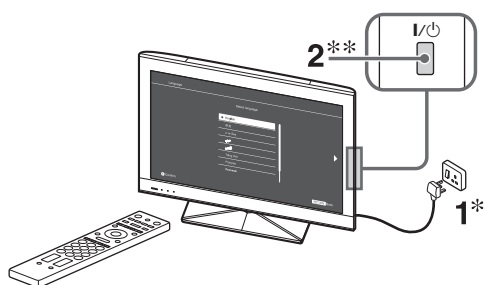
3: Preventing the TV from toppling over

An optional Sony support belt kit is used to secure the TV. Contact your nearest Sony service centre to purchase a kit. Have your TV model name ready for reference.





- 1 Install a machine screw (not supplied) into the screw hole of the TV.
- 2 Install a wood screw (not supplied) in the TV stand.

4: Performing the initial set-up



* The shapes of AC power plug and AC power outlet differ depending on the region.

**When the TV is in standby mode (the  (standby) indicator on the TV front panel is red), press  on the remote to turn on the TV.

Follow the instructions on the screen.

“Location”: Select “Home” for the best TV settings to use the TV in the home.

“Programme Sorting”: If you want to change the order of channels, follow the steps in “Programme Sorting” (page 23). Press **HOME** to exit.

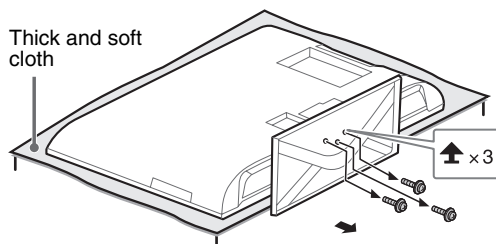
- You can also tune channels manually (page 23).
- Language options vary depending on model.

Watching TV

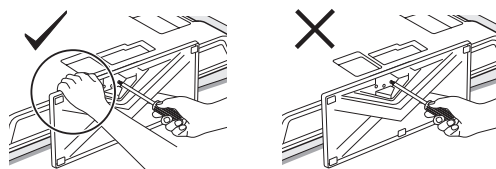
- 1 Press  on the TV to turn on the TV.
- 2 Press the number buttons or **PROG +/-** to select a TV channel.
- 3 Press  **+/-** to adjust the volume.

Detaching the stand from the TV

- Do not remove the stand for any reason other than to wall-mount the TV.
- Place the TV with its screen facing down on a level and stable surface covered with a thick and soft cloth.



- Hold the Table-Top Stand with one hand to avoid it dropping when detaching.

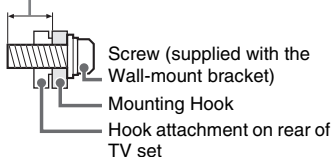
Installation/Set-up

Install and use the TV set in accordance with the instructions below in order to avoid any risk of fire, electrical shock or damage and/or injuries.

Installation

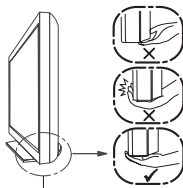
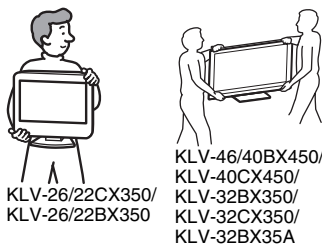
- The TV set should be installed near an easily accessible AC power outlet.
- Place the TV set on a stable, level surface to avoid it from falling down and cause personal injury or damage to the TV.
- Only qualified service personnel should carry out wall installations.
- For safety reasons, it is strongly recommended that you use Sony accessories, including:
 - KLV-46BX450/40BX450/40CX450/32BX350/32BX35A/32CX350: Wall-mount bracket SU-WL50B
 - KLV-26CX350/26BX350/22CX350/22BX350: Wall-mount bracket SU-WL100
- Be sure to use the screws supplied with the Wall-mount bracket when attaching the mounting hooks to the TV set. The supplied screws are designed so that they are 8 mm to 12 mm in length when measured from the attaching surface of the mounting hook. The diameter and length of the screws differ depending on the Wall-mount bracket model. Use of screws other than those supplied may result in internal damage to the TV set or cause it to fall, etc.

Transporting

- Before transporting the TV set, disconnect all cables.
- Two or more people are needed to transport a large TV set.
- When transporting the TV set by hand, hold it as shown below. Do not put stress on the LCD panel and the frame around the screen.



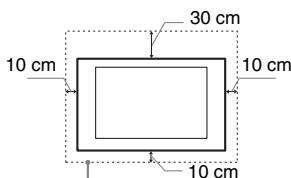
Be sure to hold the bottom of the panel, not the front part.

- When lifting or moving the TV set, hold it firmly from the bottom.
- When transporting the TV set, do not subject it to jolts or excessive vibration.
- When transporting the TV set for repairs or when moving, pack it using the original carton and packing material.

Ventilation

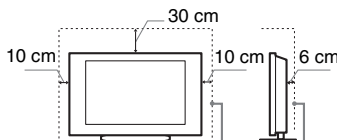
- Never cover the ventilation holes or insert anything in the cabinet.
- Leave space around the TV set as shown below.
- It is strongly recommended that you use a Sony wall-mount bracket in order to provide adequate air-circulation.

Leave at least this space around the set.

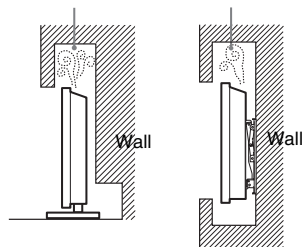
Installed with stand

- To ensure proper ventilation and prevent the collection of dirt or dust:
 - Do not lay the TV set flat, install upside down, backwards, or sideways.
 - Do not place the TV set on a shelf, rug, bed or in a closet.
 - Do not cover the TV set with a cloth, such as curtains, or items such as newspapers, etc.
 - Do not install the TV set as shown below.

Air circulation is blocked.



AC power cord

Handle the AC power cord and outlet as follows in order to avoid any risk of fire, electrical shock or damage and/or injuries:

- The shape of AC power plug, which is supplied with the TV set, varies depending on the regions.
- Use only Sony supplied AC power cords, not those of other brands.
- Insert the plug fully into the AC power outlet.
- Operate the TV set on a 110-240 V AC supply only.
- When wiring cables, be sure to unplug the AC power cord for your safety and take care not to catch your feet on the cables.
- Disconnect the AC power cord from the AC power outlet before working on or moving the TV set.
- Keep the AC power cord away from heat sources.
- Unplug the AC power plug and clean it regularly. If the plug is covered with dust and it picks up moisture, its insulation may deteriorate, which could result in a fire.

Notes

- Do not use the supplied AC power cord on any other equipment.
- Do not pinch, bend, or twist the AC power cord excessively. The core conductors may be exposed or broken.
- Do not modify the AC power cord.
- Do not put anything heavy on the AC power cord.
- Do not pull on the AC power cord itself when disconnecting the AC power cord.
- Do not connect too many appliances to the same AC power outlet.
- Do not use a poor fitting AC power outlet.

Prohibited Usage

Do not install/use the TV set in locations, environments or situations such as those listed below, or the TV set may malfunction and cause a fire, electrical shock, damage and/or injuries.

Location:

- Outdoors (in direct sunlight), at the seashore, on a ship or other vessel, inside a vehicle, in medical institutions, unstable locations, near water, rain, moisture or smoke.
- If the TV is placed in the changing room of a public bath or hot spring, the TV may be damaged by airborne sulfur, etc.



- Never spray water or detergent directly on the TV set. It may drip to the bottom of the screen or exterior parts and enter the TV set, and may cause damage to the TV set.



Environment:

- Places that are hot, humid, or excessively dusty; where insects may enter; where it might be exposed to mechanical vibration, near flammable objects (candles, etc). The TV set shall not be exposed to dripping or splashing and no objects filled with liquids, such as vases, shall be placed on the TV.
- Do not place the TV in a humid or dusty space, or in a room with oily smoke or steam (near cooking tables or humidifiers). Fire, electric shock, or warping may result.

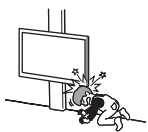


- Do not install the TV in places subject to extreme temperature such as in direct sunlight, near a radiator or a heating vent. The TV may overheat in such condition which can cause deformation of the enclosure and/or TV malfunction.



Situation:

- Do not use when your hands are wet, with the cabinet removed, or with attachments not recommended by the manufacturer. Disconnect the TV set from AC power outlet and antenna during lightning storms.
- Do not install the TV so that it sticks out into an open space. Injury or damage from a person or object bumping into the TV may result.



Broken pieces:

- Do not throw anything at the TV set. The screen glass may break by the impact and cause serious injury.
- If the surface of the TV set cracks, do not touch it until you have unplugged the AC power cord. Otherwise electric shock may result.

When not in use

- If you will not be using the TV set for several days, the TV set should be disconnected from the AC power for environmental and safety reasons.
- As the TV set is not disconnected from the AC power when the TV set is just turned off, pull the plug from the AC power outlet to disconnect the TV set completely.
- However, some TV sets may have features that require the TV set to be left in standby to work correctly.

For children

- Do not allow children to climb on the TV set.
- Keep small accessories out of the reach of children, so that they are not mistakenly swallowed.

If the following problems occur...

Turn off the TV set and unplug the AC power cord immediately if any of the following problems occur. Ask your dealer or Sony service centre to have it checked by qualified service personnel.

When:

- AC power cord is damaged.
- Poor fitting of AC power outlet.
- TV set is damaged by being dropped, hit or having something thrown at it.
- Any liquid or solid object falls through openings in the cabinet.

About LCD Monitor Temperature

When the LCD Monitor is used for an extended period, the panel surrounds become warm. You may feel hot when touching there by the hand.

Precautions

Viewing the TV

- View the TV in moderate light, as viewing the TV in poor light or during long period of time, strains your eyes.
- When using headphones, adjust the volume so as to avoid excessive levels, as hearing damage may result.

LCD Screen

- Although the LCD screen is made with high-precision technology and 99.99% or more of the pixels are effective, black dots may appear or bright points of light (red, blue, or green) may appear constantly on the LCD screen. This is a structural property of the LCD screen and is not a malfunction.
- Do not push or scratch the front filter, or place objects on top of this TV set. The image may be uneven or the LCD screen may be damaged.
- If this TV set is used in a cold place, a smear may occur in the picture or the picture may become dark. This does not indicate a failure. These phenomena disappear as the temperature rises.

- Ghosting may occur when still pictures are displayed continuously. It may disappear after a few moments.
- The screen and cabinet get warm when this TV set is in use. This is not a malfunction.
- The LCD screen contains a small amount of liquid crystal. Some fluorescent tubes used in this TV set also contain mercury. Follow your local ordinances and regulations for disposal.

Handling and cleaning the screen surface/cabinet of the TV set

Be sure to unplug the AC power cord connected to the TV set from AC power outlet before cleaning.

To avoid material degradation or screen coating degradation, observe the following precautions.

- To remove dust from the screen surface/cabinet, wipe gently with a soft cloth. If dust is persistent, wipe with a soft cloth slightly moistened with a diluted mild detergent solution.
- Never spray water or detergent directly on the TV set. It may drip to the bottom of the screen or exterior parts and enter the TV set, and may cause damage to the TV set.



- Never use any type of abrasive pad, alkaline/acid cleaner, scouring powder, or volatile solvent, such as alcohol, benzene, thinner or insecticide. Using such materials or maintaining prolonged contact with rubber or vinyl materials may result in damage to the screen surface and cabinet material.
- Periodic vacuuming of the ventilation openings is recommended to ensure to proper ventilation.
- When adjusting the angle of the TV set, move it slowly so as to prevent the TV set from moving or slipping off from its table stand.

Optional Equipment

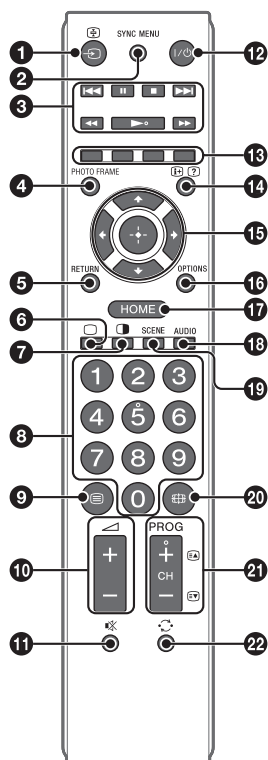
Keep optional components or any equipment emitting electromagnetic radiation away from the TV set. Otherwise picture distortion and/or noisy sound may occur.

(Caution about handling the remote control)

Notes

- Observe the correct polarity when inserting batteries.
- Do not use different types of batteries together or mix old and new batteries.
- Dispose of batteries in an environmentally friendly way. Certain regions may regulate the disposal of batteries. Please consult your local authority.
- Handle the remote with care. Do not drop or step on it, or spill liquid of any kind onto it.
- Do not place the remote in a location near a heat source, a place subject to direct sunlight, or a damp room.

Overview of the remote



- The number 5, **PROG** + and **AUDIO** buttons have tactile dots. Use the tactile dots as references when operating the TV.

- 1 – **Input select / Text hold**
 - Displays the connected equipment list and selects the input source (page 12).
 - In Text mode: Holds the current page.
- 2 **SYNC MENU**

Press to display the BRAVIA Sync Menu and then select connected HDMI equipment from “HDMI Device Selection”.

The following options can be selected from BRAVIA Sync Menu:

“**Device Control**”: Use the “Device Control” menu to operate equipment that is compatible with Control for HDMI. Select options from “Home (Menu)”, “Options” and “Content List” to operate the equipment.

“**Speakers**”: Selects “TV Speakers” or “Audio System” to output the TV’s sound from the TV speakers or connected audio equipment.

“**TV Control**”: Use the “TV Control” menu to operate the TV from the “Home (Menu)” or “Options” menu.

“**Return to TV**”: Selects this option to return to TV programme.
- 3

You can operate the BRAVIA Sync-compatible equipment that is connected to the TV.
- 4 **PHOTO FRAME (KLV-40CX450, KLV-32/26/22CX350 only)**

Press to display a photo or calendar while listening to music.
- 5 **RETURN**
 - Returns to the previous screen of any displayed menu.
 - When playing a photo/music/video file: Press to stop the playback (the display returns to the file or thumbnail view).
- 6 – **TV mode**

Exit Text mode, or switches to a TV display when displaying external input.
- 7 – **Twin Picture / PIP (page 12)**
- 8 **Number buttons**
 - Selects channels. For channel numbers 10 and above, enter the next digit quickly (page 23).
 - In Text mode: Enters the three digit page number to select the page.
- 9 – **Text**

Press repeatedly to display text information.

Text → Text over the TV picture (mix mode) → No Text (exit the Text service)
- 10 **Adjust Volume**
- 11 – **Mute / Restore Sound**
- 12 – **TV standby**

Press to turn the TV on or to switch to standby mode.
- 13 **Coloured buttons**

When the coloured buttons are available, an operation guide appears on the screen.
- 14 – **Info / Text reveal**
 - Displays information. Press once to display information about the programme/ input you are viewing. Press again to remove the display from the screen.
 - In Text mode: Reveals hidden information (e.g. answers to a quiz).
- 15 – **Item select / Enter**
 - Selects or adjusts items.
 - Confirms selected items.
 - When playing a photo file: Press to select the previous file. Press to select the next file.
 - When playing a music/video file: Press to pause/start the playback. Press and hold to fast forward/fast reverse, then release the button at the point where you want to resume playback.
- 16 **OPTIONS**

Press to display a list that contains shortcuts to some setting menus.

The listed options vary depending on the current input and content.
- 17 **HOME**

Displays or cancels the menu.
- 18 **AUDIO – Dual Sound (page 21)**

19 SCENE – Scene Select mode

Press to display the “Scene Select” menu. When you select the desired scene option, the optimum sound and picture quality for selected scene are automatically set. The options you can select may vary. Unavailable options are greyed out.

“Auto”: Delivers optimum picture and sound quality which is automatically set according to input source. There may not be any effect depending on the connected equipments.

“General”: Current user settings.

“Photo”: Delivers picture that reproduces the texture and colour of a printed photo.

“Music”: Delivers dynamic and clear sound effects like at a concert.

“Cinema”: Delivers theatre-like picture and dynamic sound.

“Game”: Delivers the best picture and sound quality for fullest game playing enjoyment.

“Graphics”: Delivers clearer detailed pictures to reduce fatigue for prolonged viewing.



“Sports”: Delivers realistic picture with surround sound like in a stadium.

20 – Wide Mode

Changes the picture size. Press repeatedly to select the desired wide mode.

21 PROG/CH +/-

- Selects the next (+) or previous (–) channel.





- In Text mode: Selects the next () or previous () page.

22 – Previous channel


Returns to the previous channel or input watched (for more than 15 seconds).





Wide Zoom* 	Enlarges the centre portion of the picture. The left and right edges of the picture are stretched to fill the 16:9 screen.
Normal 	Displays the 4:3 picture in its original size. Side bars are shown to fill the 16:9 screen.
Full 	Stretches the 4:3 picture horizontally to fill the 16:9 screen.
Zoom* 	Displays cinemascopic (letter box format) broadcasts in the correct proportions.

* Parts of the top and bottom of the picture may be cut off.

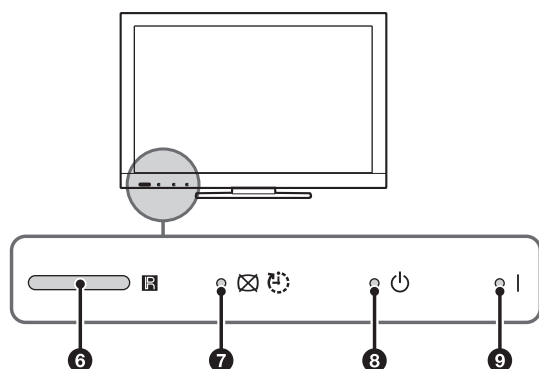
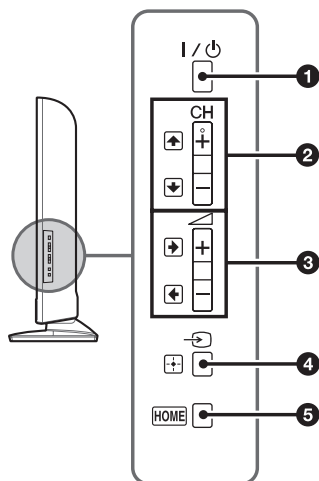

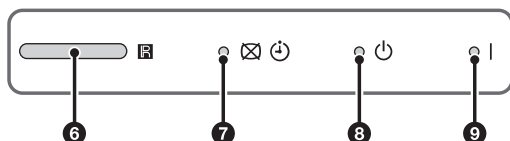
Normal 	Displays the picture in its original pixel size. Bars are shown at the top, bottom, and both sides for small picture.
Full 1 	Stretches the original picture to fill the screen vertically, keeping its original horizontal-to-vertical aspect ratio.
Full 2 	Stretches the Full 1 picture horizontally to fill the 16:9 screen.

1 I/⏻ – Power

Press to turn the TV on or to switch to standby mode.

- To disconnect the TV from the AC power completely, pull the plug from the AC power outlet.

2 CH +/- (⬆/⬇) (⬆/⬇)

- Selects the next (+) or previous (–) channel.
- In TV menu: Moves through the options up (⬆) or down (⬇).

3 ⬆ +/- (⬆/⬇) (⬆/⬇)

- Increases (+) or decreases (–) the volume.
- In TV menu: Moves through the options right (⬆) or left (⬇).

4 ⏻/⏻ – Input select / Enter

- Displays the connected equipment list and selects the input source (page 12).
- In TV menu: Selects the menu or option, and confirms the setting.

5 HOME

Displays or cancels the menu.

6 IR – Remote sensor

Receives IR signals from the remote.

Do not put anything over the sensor, doing so may affect its function.

7 ⊗/⏻ – Picture Off / Timer indicator

- Lights up in green when you select “Picture Off” (page 27).
- Lights up in amber when you set the timer (page 25) or “Photo Frame Mode” (page 13). (“Photo Frame Mode”: KLV-40CX450, KLV-32/26/22CX350 only)

8 ⏻ – Standby indicator

Lights up in red when the TV is in standby mode.

9 I – Power indicator

- Lights up in green when the TV is turned on.
- Flashes while the remote is being operated.

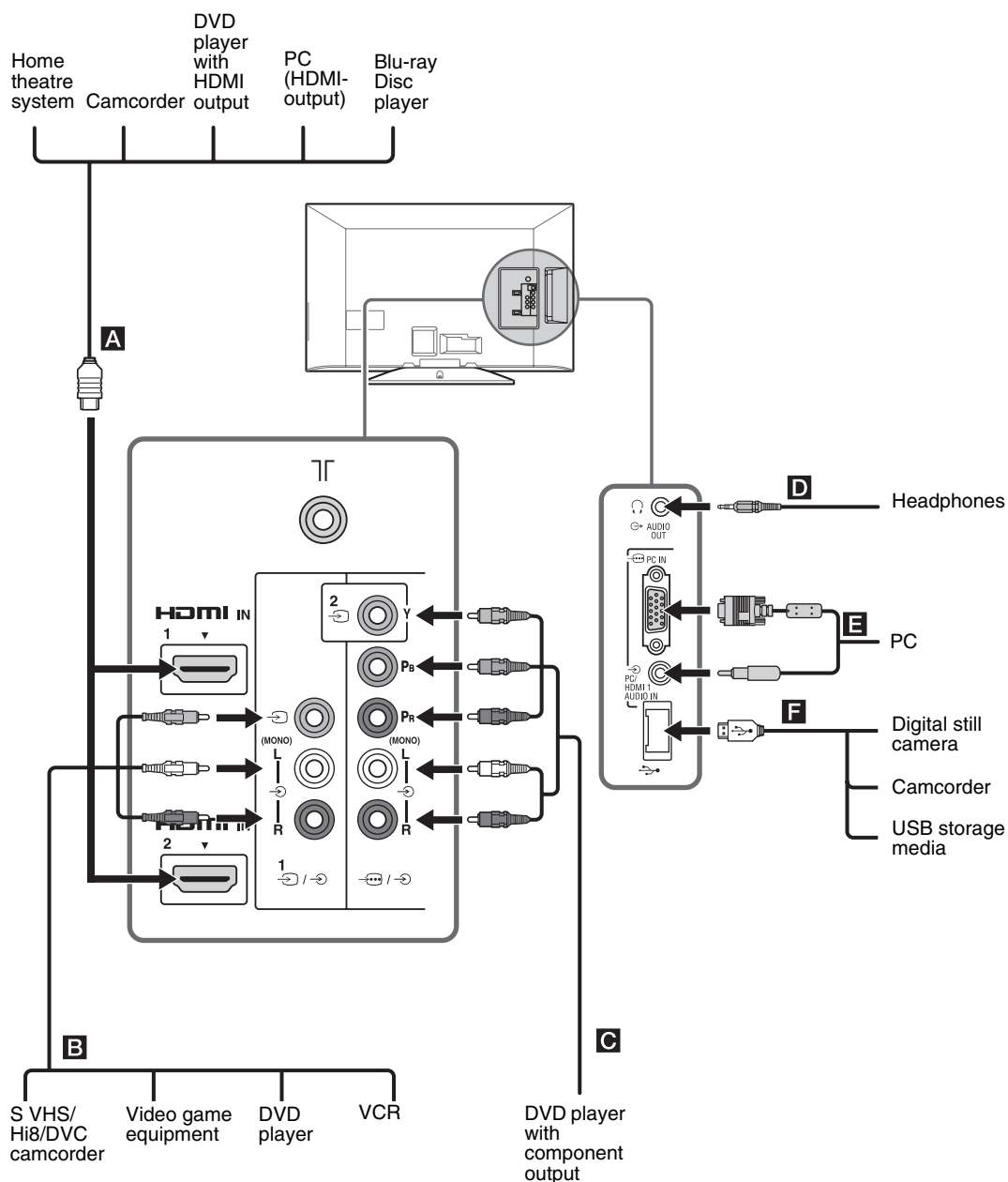
- Make sure that the TV is completely turned off before unplugging the AC power cord. Unplugging the AC power cord while the TV is turned on may cause the indicator to remain lit or may cause the TV to malfunction.

- The **CH +** button has a tactile dot. Use it as a reference when operating the TV.

Using Optional Equipment

Connecting optional equipment

You can connect a wide range of optional equipment to your TV.



Viewing pictures from the connected equipment

Turn on the connected equipment, then press / or / on the TV to display the connected equipment list.

A HDMI IN 1 or 2

Connect to the HDMI IN 1 or 2 jack if the equipment has an HDMI jack. See page 26 to set up this communication. If the equipment has a DVI jack, connect the DVI jack to the HDMI IN 1 jack through a DVI - HDMI adaptor interface (not supplied), and connect the equipment's audio out jack to the PC/HDMI 1 AUDIO IN jack in the PC IN jacks.

- The HDMI jacks can support PC timing in HDMI PC mode. See page 22 for supported PC input signal.
- Be sure to use only an authorized HDMI cable bearing the HDMI logo.

B 1/1

Connect to the video jack 1 and the audio jacks 1. If you connect mono equipment, connect to the L (MONO) jack .

C / or 2

Connect to the component jacks and the audio jacks /. For better picture quality, component connection is recommended if your DVD player has a component video output. When using the component video jack 2 as the video jack 2 select "Video 2" in the "Video 2/Component Input" menu (page 26).

D / AUDIO OUT

Connect with an audio cable or headphones. You can listen to TV sound through your stereo system or headphones. You can select "Variable" or "Fixed" in the "Audio out" menu (page 21).

E PC IN

Connect to the PC IN jack and the audio jack . It is recommended to use a PC cable with ferrite core.

F

You can enjoy photo/music/video files stored on a USB device (page 14).

Viewing Twin Picture and PIP (Picture in Picture)

This TV comes with Twin Picture (in Component and HDMI input mode) and PIP (in PC input mode) which allow you to view two pictures simultaneously.

Connect the optional equipment/PC (page 11), and make sure that images from the equipment/PC appear on the screen (page 12).

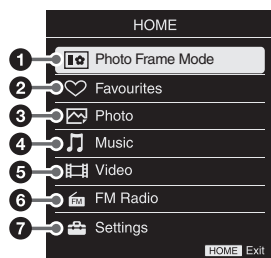
2 In sub window, you can select the TV channel or video input by pressing **OPTIONS** and select "Sub window".

To return to single picture mode

Press (Twin Picture only), **RETURN** or select "Single Picture" from Options menu.

- You cannot display resolutions higher than your TV's display resolution (page 31).
- You cannot change the size of the pictures.
- Picture smoothness may decrease when picture size reduce.
- In Twin Picture, the highlighted picture is audible. You can switch the audible picture by pressing /.
- In PIP, you can switch the audible picture by selecting "Audio Swap" from the Options menu. (only in HDMI 1 input mode)
- You can also use these features by selecting "Twin Picture" or "PIP" from the Options menu.

Navigating through menus



The **HOME** button allows you to access a variety of TV settings, USB media files and FM Radio mode and Photo Frame Mode.

- 1 Press **HOME** on the TV or remote.
- 2 Press \uparrow/\downarrow to select an option, then press \oplus .
- 3 Follow the instructions on the screen.
- 4 To exit the menu, press **HOME**.

Menu	Description
1 Photo Frame Mode	Display Photo, Music and Clock calendar at the same time.
2 Favourites	You can store up to 10 channels and/or external inputs in your Favourite list.
3 Photo	You can enjoy photo files via USB devices (page 14).
4 Music	You can enjoy music files via USB devices (page 14).
5 Video	You can enjoy video files via USB devices (page 14).
6 FM Radio	Listens to the FM Radio (page 17).
7 Settings	For details about settings, see page 19 to 27.

Using Photo Frame Mode (KLV-40CX450, KLV-32/26/22CX350 only)

You can enjoy looking at photo, listening to music, seeing the clock and calendar, at the same time.

To enter Photo Frame Mode

- 1 Press **HOME** or press **PHOTO FRAME** on the remote to select “Photo Frame Mode”.
- 2 Press **OPTIONS** on the remote in “FM Radio” or while playing back photo/music files.
- 3 Press **HOME** and select “Settings”, then select “Image Selection” or “Music Selection” under “Photo Frame Settings” from “Set-up”.

To exit Photo Frame Mode

Press **HOME** or **RETURN**.

You can switch the frame, e.g. image and clock, full screen image or full screen clock (page 25).

Using the Favourites

Allows you to set your favourite channels and/or external input by assigning the desired channel numbers and/or external input.

To watch a channel or external input

Press \uparrow/\downarrow to select the channel number or external input, then press \oplus .

To turn off the Favourite list

Press **RETURN** to return to the previous screen.









Add a current channel or external input to the Favourite list

Press \uparrow/\downarrow to select “Add to Favourites”, then press \oplus .

- Favourite channels and external inputs can also be added using the **OPTIONS** button on the remote.
- When you run the “Auto Tuning”, only the “Programme” channels in your Favourites list will be cleared.
- When you continue to add items beyond the 10th item, the bottom item in the list will be automatically removed from the Favourite list.






Playing back photo/music/video via USB


You can enjoy photo/music/video files stored in a Sony digital still camera or camcorder through a USB cable or USB storage device on your TV.

Troubleshooting

When the  (standby) indicator is flashing, count how many times it flashes (interval time is three seconds).




Press **I/** on the TV to turn it off, disconnect the AC power cord, and inform your dealer or Sony service centre of how the indicator flashes (number of flashes).

When it is not flashing

Check the items listed below. If the problem still persists, have your TV serviced by qualified service personnel.

Picture

No picture and no sound

- Check the antenna/cable connection.
- Connect the TV to the AC power outlet, and press **I/** on the TV. If the  (standby) indicator lights up in red, press **I/**.

No picture from connected equipment.

- Press **->** repeatedly to select the desired input.
- Check the connection between the optional equipment and the TV.

Double images or ghosting

- Check the antenna/cable connection, location or direction.

Only snow and noise appear on the screen

- Check if the antenna is broken or bent.
- Check if the antenna has reached the end of its serviceable life (three to five years in normal use, one to two years at the seaside).

Distorted picture (dotted lines or stripes)

- Keep the TV away from electrical noise sources such as cars, motorcycles, hair-dryers or optional equipment.
- When installing optional equipment, leave some space between the optional equipment and the TV.
- Check the antenna/cable connection.
- Keep the antenna/cable away from other connecting cables.

Picture or sound noise when viewing a TV channel

- Adjust “AFT” (Automatic Fine Tuning) to obtain better picture reception (page 23).

Tiny black points and/or bright points appear on the screen

- The screen is composed of pixels. This is not a malfunction.

Picture contours are distorted

- Change the current setting of “Cinema Drive” to other settings (page 19).

No colour on programmes

- Select “Reset” (page 19).

No picture from the connected equipment

- Turn the connected equipment on.
- Check the cable connection.
- Press **->** repeatedly to select the desired input.
- Correctly insert the USB device.
- Make sure that the USB device has been properly formatted.
- Operations are not guaranteed for all USB devices. Also, operations differ depending on the features of the USB device and the video being played.

Sound

No sound, but good picture

- Press **Δ +/-** or **M** (Mute).
- Check if the “Speakers” is set to “TV Speakers” (page 21).

No sound or noisy sound

- Check if the TV system setting is appropriate (page 23).

Channels

Some channels are blank

- The channel is for scrambled/subscription service only. Subscribe to a pay TV service.
- Channel is used only for data (no picture or sound).
- Contact the broadcaster for transmission details.

General

The TV turns off automatically (the TV enters standby mode)
